 development, integrated learning and universal foundation skills; satisfactorily completes the equivalent of 2 units of study (2 to hours) in Coree
 and Technical Education coursework and work-based learning (including at least 54 hours of work-based learning); and has at least 1 completed
 employability profile

Skills and Achievement Commencement (Students with severe disabilities that are assessed using the NYSAA, Non-diploma Exiting Credential)

 All students with severe disabilities who attend school for not less than 12 years, excluding Kindergatten exit with this credential which must be accompanied by documentation of the student's skills and strengths and levels of independence in academic, career development and foundation skills needed for post-school living, learning and working.

Note: Non Regents Pathway exams are not subject to the Appeal Process

Non-Diploma Credentials

Career Development and Occupational Studies (CDOS) Commencement Credential (for all students except those who participate in the NYS Alternate Assessment)

Beginning in 9th grade, and over the course of four or more years, students can work toward the achievement of a CDOS Commencement Credential in addition to a diploma. CDOS Commencement Credential certifies that a student has successfully participated in career planning and developed the skills needed for job opportunities. The certificate of work-readiness can be used as an option to meet one of the five exam/assessments required for a diploma.

Option 1 Requirements

- 1) Developed a Career Plan documenting career goals and preparation (updated yearly)
- 2) Completed a minimum of 216 hours of Career &Technical Education (CTE) coursework and/or work based learning experiences (at least 54 of the 216 hours must be in work-based learning experiences)
- 3) Demonstrated achievement of the NYS CDOS learning standards
- 4) At least one **Employability Profile** documenting work-related skills and experiences

Option 2 Requirements Passes a state-approved nationally recognized work-readiness credential exam

Skills and Achievement Commencement Credential

(Certificate only awarded to students with severe disabilities who participated in NYS Alternate Assessment)

- -Documents a student's level of academic achievement and independence based on alternate grade level standards, skills, strengths, interests, and other accomplishments.
- -Skills and Achievement Commencement Credential provides students with instruction and learning experiences to support and improve opportunities for post-school living, learning and working.

Things to Remember!

- All students must be held to high expectations and be provided with meaningful opportunities to participate and progress in the general education curriculum to prepare them to graduate with a Regents or local diploma. NYS research shows the majority of students can meet the State's learning standards for graduation.
- Students who earn a Regents or local diploma are no longer eligible to attend high school or receive special education services. Students who do not meet graduation requirements have the right to attend school until they earn a diploma or until the end of the school year in which they turn age 21.
- ◆ The CDOS Commencement Credential is not a diploma but certifies a student has the knowledge and skills necessary for entry-level employment. Students who are unable to earn a regular diploma may exit with the CDOS Commencement Credential as their only exiting credential.
- ◆ The Skills and Achievement Commencement Credential is not a diploma. All students who take the New York State Alternate Assessment will receive this credential as they exit from school along with a summary of their achievements and overall performance.



Earning a Diploma in NYS



Thinking about life after high school is exciting! A critical part of preparing for this transition is learning what is required in order for your child to graduate. Are you aware that your child

must earn a required number of credits and pass certain state exams? Did you know there are different diploma options depending on test score results? Have you heard about ways your child can participate in work-based learning experiences to develop skills needed for future job opportunities? This guide provides information to understand all the requirements and multiple pathways to graduation.



Multiple Pathway Options (4+1)

- The CDOS Commencement Credential
- Pass an additional Regents exam/assessment in a different course or department approved alternative (in English, math, social studies, or science)
- A Career & Technical Education (CTE) assessment
- An Arts assessment
- A Language Other Than English (LOTE) assessment

Regents Diploma (for all students)

required for graduation.

-65 on 4 Regents exams (English language arts, math, science, & social studies) and meets requirements of 1 Pathway Option *Schools may require students to take all 5 Regents

Appeal Process (for Regents exams only)

A student who has failed one or two of the required Regents exams twice, has sought academic help and meets all credit and course requirements, may appeal to graduate with a diploma using a lower score. An appeal may be submitted to the principal by a student, parent or teacher. The appeal must be recommended by the teacher or department chairperson in the subject of the Regents exam under appeal. A school appeal committee makes a recommendation to the Superintendent to approve or deny the appeal.

Regents Diploma through 1 Appeal (for all students)

 - 65 on 3 required Regents exams and successful appeal of 1 Regents score(60-64) and meets requirements of 1 Pathway Option

Local Diploma through 2 Appeals (for all students)

-65 on 2 required Regents exams and successful appeal of 2 Regents scores (60-64) and meets requirements of 1 Pathway Option

Local Diploma for students who are classified as English Language Learners

- 65 on 2 required Regents exams and successful appeal of 1 Regents exam (60-64) and 1 successful appeal of ELA exam (55-59) and meets requirements of 1 Pathway Option

Local Diploma Scoring Options for Students with Disabilities



Low Pass Safety Net (for students with an IEP, if recommended in a 504 Plan or if recommended for students declassified while in grades 8-12)

- 55 or higher on required Regents exams

Local Diploma with Appeal

- successful appeal of up to two Regents exams scores of 52-54

Compensatory Safety Net (for students with an IEP, if recommended in a 504 Plan or if recommended for students declassified while in grades 8-12)

- A score of 65 or higher on any single Regents exam may compensate for a score between 45-54 on a social studies or science Regents exam. A one for one exchange on up to two exams. Students must score 55 on math and ELA exams (or 52-54 through successful appeal) and meet course requirements

Superintendent's Determination

(for students with a current IEP only)

- If a student does not meet graduation requirements through Safety Net options, a parent may submit a written request for the Superintendent to conduct a review of other documentation and evidence of graduation level proficiency in the subject areas of science, social studies or a second math (one math & the ELA scores must be 55 or 52-54 through successful appeal). To be eligible for a review, the student must actively participate in the Regents exam and meet credit and course requirements. Written notification is provided which indicates that the Superintendent has determined that the student has either met or has not met the requirements for a local diploma.

1.) Pathways

- •Pass an additional math Regents examination in a different course or Department Approved Alternative; or
- Pass an additional science Regents examination in a different course or Department Approved Alternative; or
- •Pass an additional social studies Regents examination in a different course or Department Approved Alternative; or
- •Pass an additional English assessment in a different course selected from the Department Approved Alternative list; or
- Pass a Department approved CTE pathway assessment, following successful completion of an approved CTE program; or
- •Pass a Department approved pathway assessment in the Arts; or
- •Pass a Department approved pathway assessment in a Language other than English (LOTE)

2.) Appeals:

Appeals are subject to local district approval. More information on the appeal to graduate with a lower score on a Regents examination can be found at http://www.p12.nvsed.gov/ciai/gradreg/Documents/CurrentAppealForm.pdf

3.) Special Endorsements:

Honors: A student earns a computed average of at least 90 on the Regents examinations applicable to either a Regents diploma or a Regents diploma with advanced designation. No⊮nore than 2 Department approved alternatives can be substituted for Regents examinations and the locally developed Checkpoint B LOTE examination is not included in the calculation.

Mastery in Math and/or Science: A student meets all the requirements for a Regents
Diploma with Advanced Designation AND earns at score of 85 or better on 3 math
Regents examinations and/or 3 science Regents examinations.

Technical Endorsement: A student meets the requirements for either a local diploma, a Regents diploma or a Regents diploma with advanced designation AND successfully completes a Department approved CTE program including the 3 part technical assessment

4.) Transition to the Common Core Regents Assessments:

ELA: Students who enter grade 9 in 2013 and thereafter must pass the Regents examination in ELA Common Core in order to meet the diploma requirements.

Mathematics: In 2013 and thereafter any student, regardless of grade level or cohort who begins their first commencement level course in mathematics must be provided with instruction aligned with the NYS P-12 Common Core Learning Standards for Mathematics and take the corresponding Common Core Regents examination. 5.) Students with disabilities who entered grade 9 prior to September 2011:

Students with disabilities who enter grade 9 prior to the 11-12 school year who fail one or more Regents examinations may take the corresponding Regents Competency Test (RCT) in order to meet the assessment requirements. This option may not be used in conjunction with the Compensatory Safety Net Option.

6.) Languages other than English (LOTE) exempt students:

Students with a disability may be excused from the requirement from the required units of credit in LOTE if so indicated on the IEP but must still earn 22 units of credit to graduate. A LOTE exempt student who seeks a Regents diploma with advanced designation, does NOT have to complete the 5 unit sequence in the Arts or CTE in lieu of LOTE in order to meet the assessment requirements for the Advanced Diploma.
